When Stride Treglown set out to design The Courtyard, a development that hoped to offer retirement properties in Cornwall, they were met with both opportunities and challenges.

The site featured historic greenery, was surrounded by existing wildlife (including bats) and offered unparalleled views towards the sea. However, the site was small. The historic buildings were in poor condition. It had become a dumping ground for building materials and a closed green site was in front that their work had to cut for them.

The project needed to respect the existing structures – but buildings had to be fitted out to meet the needs of modern living. The project also offered opportunities – to that the site had a rich history and a strong sense of place. Old farm buildings and a stable now house cottages. New builds on the site include mixed cottages, apartments

and houses. There are 28 residences on the site including "weekenders".
